A SPECIAL THANKS

We wish to extend a grateful "thank you" to our donors for your overwhelming generosity in response to our plea for support for relief work in Lebanon. In three months, ANERA donors provided \$100,000 in aid for that devastated country, and \$300,000 in crucial medical supplies. Of that amount, \$25,000 has already been given to the United Nations Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA) to purchase generators for powerless clinics in South Lebanon. Those generators are installed and working today. Medical supplies reached Lebanon in three shipments: first to the Palestine Red Crescent Society shortly before the invasion; next to the American University Hospital on July 30th; and a final shipment the second week of August to the Middle East Council of Churches for distribution to Beirut hospitals.

ANERA's President and Middle East Representative are travelling to Lebanon in September to determine ANERA's future projects to help rebuild the country.

In addition to many kind donations, ANERA also received very moving letters from our donors. These are comments from just a few:



"I would like to have a small part in making amends for the part my government has had in the many injustices heaped upon the Palestinian people."

"We are distraught by the wanton destruction in Lebanon..."

"I am appalled and angry about what has taken place in Lebanon and the West Bank zone in recent months. This makes me very happy to have been able to help your organization to do its work."

"Please let it be known that many Americans support the Palestinians..."

"I am truly outraged over the shabby and terribly wrong treatment the world is handing out to these good people. And I am sincerely praying that God may see fit to help them and reward their suffering and their patience."

"In sympathy for a people cruelly wronged..."

"When I consider that this [gift] goes to the Palestinians in Lebanon — now when those in the West Bank and Gaza are themselves in need — it makes me wish I could give much more."

"... a little something extra at this awful time for your work in Lebanon."



ANERA'S FINANCES

ANERA donors, individuals, organizations, and corporations, responded generously in 1982 not only to the immediate needs in Lebanon, but to the on-going efforts of Palestinians in the West Bank and Gaza Strip to build viable and fruitful lives.

The circle at right represents ANERA's expenditures in fiscal year 1982, which total \$1,106,058. ANERA's FY 1982 annual audit can be obtained by contacting the ANERA office.

While the 21% of ANERA expenditures for fundraising and management costs is acceptable, the figure would have been considerably lower if the Israeli military government had approved more of our humanitarian projects for which we have funding available through a grant from the United States Agency for International Development (U.S.A.I.D.). Approximately \$1,000,000 of U.S.A.I.D. funded ANERA projects for the Palestinians in the West Bank and Gaza Strip are being held up as of this writing.



ANERA GRANTS, FISCAL YEAR 1982

In fiscal year 1982.ANERA gave a total of \$695,279 to projects assisting Palestinians and Lebanese. Of this amount, \$597,228 was in cash grants and services, and \$98,051 was in gifts-in-kind and shipping.
