Dear Friends,

Last year was among the most challenging in Anera's 58-year history. Throughout 2025, and continuing today, we have operated at the center of a widening regional war and deepening humanitarian crisis, as suffering reached unprecedented levels across Palestine and Lebanon, and to a lesser extent, Jordan.

In Gaza, the destruction of essential systems has left families without reliable access to food, healthcare, clean water or shelter. In the West Bank, escalating violence, destruction and restrictions are deepening hardships. In Lebanon, war has displaced vast numbers and strained public services. Education has halted for hundreds of thousands in Palestine and Lebanon. In Jordan, the pressures of hosting displaced populations grow. Across the region, needs are acute and compounding, outpacing resources and demanding sustained humanitarian response.

In this context, Anera's locally rooted teams continue to adapt quickly to shifting needs. **Our work is made possible by people like you** – from a global community of donors and international and local partners, whose deep commitment to humanity and to the people of the region continues to drive Anera's mission forward. We continue to deliver from a position of financial stability, operational discipline and full legal compliance.

Operating in active conflict zones has slowed, but not stopped, program implementation in parts of Palestine due to access and security constraints. We are working hard to accelerate our response across the region in 2026. Even so, we are accelerating our response across the region in 2026.

Anera's response has also evolved to meet the regional nature of this crisis. While maintaining full commitment to core programs in Palestine and Lebanon, we have expanded targeted efforts to support displaced Palestinians, Lebanese and Syrians across and within borders, including in Jordan, Egypt and Syria. This regional approach provides continuity of care for those affected, wherever they seek safety.

This past year has shown both urgency and adaptability, and the power of collective action to sustain life-saving support under extraordinary conditions. Thank you for your continued generosity and for reviewing this report on what your support has made possible.

Because of donor support, Anera delivered 489,000 medical treatments in Lebanon in 2025, 50% of which were for chronic disease patients like Rita, helping to continue vital care.
